Renison Tin and Mount Lyell Mining Co both planned to close their operations. These closures did not eventuate but the family felt the need to diversify so as not to completely rely on the West Coast mining industry. Today the West Coast mining industry is still an important part of the business and the Company is also heavily involved in General transport, freight forwarding, storage and distribution, waste management, bulk cartage and aquaculture support. This diversification has also led to the establishment of depots in Launceston, Hobart, Devonport, a cold storage complex in Burnie plus marine division to service the Tasmanian aquaculture industry.

The Government and the Resources Industry **8.30 – 9.00 am**

The Honourable Paul Harriss, Minister for Resources

Paul trained as a draftsman at the Hydro between 1971-76, then moved to the private sector and continued his drafting career with a Hobart architectural firm, before returning to the Hydro. In 1981 Paul moved away from drafting, taking up a position in the Local Government Office working with council building surveyors in the administration of the building regulations. In 1996, Paul was elected to the Legislative Council as the Member for Huon and during his 18 years there advocated strongly for the forestry and mining industries. He was elected to the seat of Franklin in 2014.

The Honourable Rene Hidding, Minister for Infrastructure, Minister for Police and Emergency Management

Rene Hidding is one of the Tasmanian Parliament's most experienced Members, now in his 19th year in Parliament. He was elected in 1996 and following seven years as an Alderman of the City of Launceston. Rene was part of a substantial family business in the building and hardware industry. Rene represents the electorate of Lyons in the Tasmanian House of Assembly. He served as Cabinet Secretary in the Rundle Government and was Leader of the Opposition for four years from 2002. Rene has developed a strong background in public policy development across most portfolios and currently is the Minister for Police and Emergency Management and Minister for Infrastructure, and Portfolio Minister for five state owned companies.

Bryan was elected to Parliament in 1998 and has held a variety of roles and Ministries over the subsequent years, including Government Whip, Parliamentary Secretary to the Deputy Premier, Minister of Primary Industries, Water and Environment, Minister for Infrastructure, Energy and Resources, Deputy Premier and Minister for Economic Development, Minister for Resources and Minister for Sport and Recreation.

The 2010 election saw Bryan re-elected for a fourth term resulting in Bryan being given the position of Deputy Premier and Minister for various portfolios by his Labor parliamentary colleagues. After the 2014 election, Bryan was elected by the caucus as the Leader of the Opposition as well as Shadow Minister for State Growth and Shadow Minister for Resources.


